

THE DRAMA DIARY

During the course you need to keep a working diary that explains in detail everything you have done in the lessons and also anything you have done in your own time. This will be classed as your independent learning for the next two years and it will assist you when it is time to revise for your written exam. It will also assist you in each controlled assessment, as it will give you ideas to include in your work.

In your diary you should...

- Record what you did in drama sessions and what your thoughts and feelings about the sessions were.
- Jot down ideas about roles you are developing.
- Make sketches and diagrams for costume and set design.
- Keep notes on plays you are studying and performances you have seen.
- Record what different drama techniques and explorative strategies you have used.
- Jot down questions raised for you by your work in drama and notes on things you want to find out more about.

Keeping your diary up to date is very important and it should be done as soon as possible after your lesson so that you can remember everything clearly. I shall collect in your diaries once every half term to check your progress.
